When Naudiea Davis first arrived at Peabody's El Segundo and Lee Ranch mines for a summer internship, she immediately felt at home.

"I come from a small farming community and the people at this mine reminded me of my family," she said. "I loved the atmosphere and worked as hard as I could."

She was joined by Cole Hill, an engineering intern at North Antelope Rochelle Mine (NARM) and a Montana Tech student, as a recipient of Peabody's Americas Operations Intern Scholarship.

Naudiea and Cole's strong work ethic coupled with their academic success led to successful internships and eventual scholarships.
