7. REPORT BY IAN FLOOD

<u>WEP – 1A Mod</u>

- DA Boundary Amendment
 - o Potential impacts to future modification processes due to pending Crown Land determination.
- Planned accommodation facility on site noted the significant strain on housing availability in Mudgee and Gulgong especially with the proposed Central West & Orana Renewable Energy Zone project. Discussion regarding the demountable accommodation structure for approximately 100 people. The concept will align with what was originally approved in the EIS but was never built. Council consultation has begun and are supportive of the concept due to the local housing shortage.

WEP - offset areas

• The land transfer and management fee payment to NPWS was completed on 2 August 2023

<u>EL 9399</u>

• Exploration Licence 9399 update – 121 holes have been completed to the 29 August 2023. Results are as expected

- 35 sites have been rehabilitated to date
- 60 sites have been grouted
- Third drill rig will commence on 7 September 2023 that will initially target the remaining holes in the Tralee valley area
- Baseline study update
 - o SVC application advertisement will be in the newspaper in the coming weeks. CCC will be notified when advertisement is published
 - o The first step to the SVC application will be made by advertising in the newspaper. Then the SVC application will be submitted to DPE.
 - o Discussion regarding BSAL soil sampling location, concept and reporting. IF to send email to members to advise when the scoping letter and report is available.
 - o A scoping letter will be developed for the amendment application, the CCC will be kept updated; the scoping letter should be available before the end of 2023.

WCPL - RFS Participation

- Two separate Wollar Solar truck accidents were attended by WCPL
- WCPL RFS vehicle being maintained in preparation for the fire season
- Water supply dam on Ulan-Wollar Road (accessible by RFS) level increased

8. Report by Kieren Bennetts

Wilpinjong Coal Mine CCC tour

- Members invited to join a mine site tour (mine tour attendees: LA, SM, MTK, TA, RP, KD, CP, KB, JH, CP, SMag, TO)
- Question: 70ha of rehab has been carried out in the last 12 months. Could you provide a comparison of rehabilitation vs disturbance per previous meetings?
- Attendees spent approximately two hours being escorted around the mine site viewing operational and rehabilitated areas

Attended noise monitoring

- Attended noise monitoring results presented all demonstrated compliance with applicable noise criteria
- Hard copies of the noise reports are offered and shared with members
- **Question:** Could the dBC be reported separately at the time of the monitoring when a 'mining continuum' is recorded. This is an important factor for calculating the low frequency noise compliance.
 - o Answer: WCPL will discuss this with EMM who undertake attended noise monitoring for WCPL

Real Time Noise Monitoring Locations

- **Question:** (BS) The Ringwood Road noise monitoring location BS believes it doesn't pick up the noise that is being heard near the location. WCPL have offered to shift it to a more suitable location How long will the monitor be out of action?
 - **Answer**: Downtime would be approximately 3-4 hours to pack up and move it, however a calibration would be performed at the same time so it would take a bit longer. If a location within the relevant Lot/DP could be pinpointed and shared by BS with Wilpinjong, it can be checked for viability

Blast Monitoring

• Compliant with overpressure and vibration criteria

Air Quality

• Remains compliant with dust gauges, HVAS and TEOM criteria

Surface Water Discharge

• Compliant with EPL criteria, no exceedances

Operational Downtime

- Approximately 704.6 hours of lost time in digger, loader and dozer hours
- Lost time was due to rain, noise, lightning, fog and dust in order of highest lost hours to lowest

- Question: (BS) With the expected impact of the two extra power lines that will be coming through, how will the rehabilitation be managed?
 - o Answer: (IF) The powerline projects are responsible for their own offsets. Wilpinjong will still regenerate to the BVT and the electricity proponent will maintain as needed.

9. GENERAL BUSINESS

Question: (BS) Houses in the village – there has been asbestos checks in some houses; why have those buildings only just been tested:

Answer: (IF) A register is kept for asbestos in houses and was developed some years ago; the register must be updated every 3 years. Anything that is existing will be retested every 3 years

Discussion: Regarding the presence of asbestos and WCPL's program for demolishing houses. IF stated that the community historically requested a commitment for minimum number of houses for annual demolition; the presence of asbestos is not the only factor in the decision making in the demolition of properties.

Discussion: Demolition of houses in Wollar seems contradictory to the fact that there is a housing crisis and WCPL are proposing to erect an accommodation facility. A request from the community was included in the SIMP because the community didn't want uninhabitable houses to remain in Wollar; a commitment to number of houses demolished per year was asked for during the stakeholder consultation for the SIMP by local residents

Question: RP Could the mine investigate the location of blast sentries on Mogo Road when blasting in Pit 8. Example: approximately two weeks ago a blast sentry was located on Mogo Road near the intersection with Ulan Wollar Road. This location restricted Mogo Road residents from accessing Wollar, which is in the opposite direction to the blast. Action: IF
